Local Methodist Minister opening CRE

The Reverend David Martin is a popular preacher, speaker and enthusiast for mission. He is well known for his national role in Methodism's youth work (MAYC), as a leader with Easter People, and more recently through evangelism initiatives in Devon. He has been a Methodist minister for 30 years, and in September 2006 he moved to Plymouth to serve as Mission and Development Enabler for the Methodist District. He is co-tutor for the Mission Shaped Ministry (Fresh Expressions) course in the area and is a leader of Devote - a small discipleship community meeting in a chocolaterie on Plymouth Barbican.

24/7 prayer room at CRE

24-7 Prayer is hosting a prayer room for the duration of the exhibition. 24-7 Prayer is an international, interdenominational movement of prayer, mission and justice that began with a single, student-led prayer vigil in Chichester, England in 1999 and has spread, by word-of-mouth, into 100+ nations.

For more than a decade the global 24-7 Prayer meeting has continued unbroken, impacting locations as diverse as the US Naval Academy, a German punk festival, war-zones and underground churches, the slums of Delhi, the jungles of Papua New Guinea, ancient English cathedrals, a brewery in Missouri, and now CRE Southwest.



Stop the Traffik will be directing traffic

If you come to the exhibition by car you will be met by stewards from Stop the Traffik, the international organisation set up to bring a stop to people trafficking.

Stop the Traffik is one of the partners at CRE Southwest and there will be seminars and interviews bringing a fuller understanding of how vital it is to stop human trafficking.

Stop the Traffik are exhibiting in Mission Walk near the seminar rooms. Copies of STOP THE TRAFFIK: People Shouldn't Be Bought And Sold by Steve Chalke and Cherie Blair (Lion Hudson) will also be on sale in the massive CRE bookshop.



24/7 will also be hosting a daily seminar detailing the development of the concept and explaining how to set up your own 24/7 prayer room. They will also have a stand in Mission Walk where you can find out more details. You can join the prayers in the hall between the exhibition hall and the Arts Theatre.

Mind & Soul zone

Mind & Soul zone is dedicated to organisations that specialise in mental health, emotional health and healing and is run in association with Premier Lifeline.

The aim of the Mind & Soul zone is to raise awareness about how Christianity relates to mental health – how it can help those who struggle and to provide practical support to those who minister and work within this area.



Return to Sender zone

Churches deal with death every working day and this zone is designed to assist them in this difficult task. It will feature the new 'lifestyle' funerals which help communities more effectively deal with loss. This CRE zone provides a vital place to discuss issues connected with changing needs. It will also feature some of the alternatives to standard funerals such as a motorbike and sidecar for a hearse, which will be on show at the exhibition.
